
Reflecting on 2020: #LearningSavesLives

OpenWHO wins Gold at Learning Technologies Awards

The OpenWHO learning platform, powered by Hasso Plattner Institute solutions, was awarded the Gold prize for the 'Best international digital transformation of a training programme in response to COVID-19' at the Learning
Technologies Awards on 18 November.

"The judges were impressed by the speed and scalability of OpenWHO, the dynamic learning environment created to lead and facilitate a worldwide frontline response to the pandemic now and in the future," the panel noted.

Others shortlisted in the category included the British Council, Novartis, Open University of Hong Kong, University of Fort Hare and Metlife.




New courses on COVID-19 vaccines, country intra-action reviews close 2020

Working with WHO expert teams,
OpenWHO launched the following
courses in December to transfer critical
knowledge for the evolving COVID-19
pandemic:

- a course to provide health workers with knowledge for safe and efficient COVID-19 vaccine administration;
- a course to help focal points in countries develop national deployment and vaccination plans for COVID-19 vaccines; and
- a course to help countries conduct national and sub-national intraaction reviews to identify and share best practices and apply lessons learned during the ongoing COVID-19 response to change the trajectory of the outbreak.

The new courses close a landmark year for OpenWHO, in which the platform produced an average of 13 COVID-19 courses and 4 new languages each month. This led to an average 415 155 monthly enrolments on the platform, with 80% in COVID-19 courses.

One year of pandemic learning response on OpenWHO.org

The COVID-19 pandemic brought a surge of new users to the OpenWHO platform in 2020.

The graph above illustrates the growth in total OpenWHO enrolments, COVID-19 course enrolments and certificates awarded by the platform, alongside the growth in COVID-19 course and language offerings.

The first COVID-19 course launched on 26 January in English and by the end of December the platform hosted 148 COVID-19 courses spanning 22 topics and 43 languages.

Mainly fueled by the COVID-19 courses, OpenWHO has grown exponentially (+2669%) in one year of responding to its first pandemic, a key motivation for its creation. Total enrolments increased from 160 000 in January to 4.7 million in December.
